Wilderness Hiking

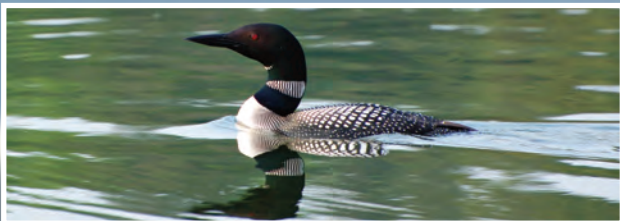
